#### Alie Street, Hoardings

Rainbow-coloured artwork Inspired by bacteria, viruses and cells, created by local primary school children from <u>English Martyrs Catholic Primary School</u> is being used to decorate the hoardings of the building site of the new College premises.

Pupils from the school which is located just behind Alie Street, originated the pathology-related artwork which was commissioned by the College. The hoardings are being used at the construction site Alie Street, which will be the new location of the College's purpose-built premises when building work is completed in late 2018. <u>Alie Street hoardings</u>.

This novel study day aimed at senior trainees and consultant histopathologists will explain how gynaecological pathology data is used to guide patient management as well as discussing the significance of each data item in different clinical scenarios and specimen types. The course will enable attendees to adopt a more efficient personalised approach to histopathology reporting by focussing on accurately reporting data items that are clinically relevant in a particular case.

#### Mycology laboratory diagnostic capacity survey: ESPAUR/PHE/BSMM

This survey is designed to help Public Health England (PHE) and the British Society for Medical Mycology (BSMM) understand current mycology laboratory practice and capabilities throughout the UK, following updated BSMM standards for diagnosis of serious fungal diseases in 2015. The survey was created with the support of the UK Clinical Mycology Network (UK CMN).

The results of the survey will help to raise awareness of antifungal diagnostics, identify areas of improvement for the management of serious fungal diseases and inform national antifungal surveillance activities.

The survey may take around 10-15 minutes to complete. Please complete the <u>survey</u> in one sitting. The survey will close on 08 May 2017.

#### Applications open for CM-Path Technology and Informatics Lead

The National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) Cellular Molecular Pathology (CM-Path) initiative aims to improve diagnosis and treatment of cancer patients and also brings together a working group of experts from pathology and other disciplines to form four workstreams:

- **Skills and capacity** to enhance academic opportunities and promote continuous up-skilling of the cellular pathology workforce.
- **Clinical trials** to encourage profession-wide engagement of pathologists with clinical trials and associated research.
- **Discovery** to focus on boosting activities in 'hub' centres of excellence, where pathologists have roles in investigating the biology of cancer and its treatments.
- Technology and informatics to promote continuous innovation in cellular molecular pathology and pathology informatics.

We are recruiting a Technology and Informatics lead, who will be responsible for leadership of the Technology and Informatics workstream. The successful candidate will also be a member of the CM-Path Executive Group, which includes the CM-Path chairperson, all workstream leads, representatives from the RCPath and the Pathological Society of Great Britain & Ireland, as well as funder and consumer representatives.
