President's Message

Prioritising suspected cancer patients for diagnostic capacity

NHS England has written to integrated care boards and trusts setting out the need to prioritise improvements to wait times for patients referred for urgent suspected cancer over the coming year.

I was featured in the <u>Daily Mail</u> about the announcement of support for pathology services, which we welcome. This will help our members provide the quicker diagnoses that patients need. We have long asked for improvements in digital pathology and infrastructure to help provide better patient care.

RCPath Qualitative Survey 2023

The survey has been sent to Clinical Directors and covers workload, staffing, vacancies, locum cover and the working environment.

Working for members

Neuropathology Workforce Report published

As part of the RCPath Meeting Pathology Demand series, the College collaborated with the British Neuropathological Society (BNS) to carry out a survey of the neuropathology workforce.

The College has published <u>The neuropathology workforce: challenges and solutions</u>. The intention of the survey was to help determine whether there is the right number of staff with the right skills in the right places to ensure safe and effective high-quality patient care and support. Like many pathologists, neuropathologists have a role in the direct management and treatment of patients as well as interpreting data derived from diagnostic tests and establishing neuropathological diagnoses.

<u>Digital Pathology Symposium – The Role of Digital Pathology in Training and Beyond –</u> Hybrid Event

15 June 2023

6 CPD credits

This hybrid symposium will provide a complete overview of the role of digital pathology (DP) in training and beyond. It will explore a broad range of topics including:

- the process of integrating DP into a working pathology department and the role it plays for both trainees and consultants involved in training, including tips and tricks learned from real-life experiences
- the benefits of DP in teaching and revision and the future of RCPath examinations in the digital era
- an overview to demystify artificial intelligence and review how this can help support pathologists both now and in the future
- additional topics surrounding DP such as ethical and environmental considerations.

The symposium is open to all practicing pathologists. It will be of particular interest to histopathology trainees and consultants involved in training (including educational supervisors and training programme directors).

This event will be an excellent primer for those embarking on their digital pathology journey whilst providing valuable insights for pathologists already in the process of using DP.

Cytopathology Study Day - Hybrid Event - Bookings now open

The programme will consist of a series of slide seminars covering specimen types such as urine, serous fluids, and samples from various sites including head & neck, respiratory tract and pancreatico-biliary tract.

The format will be that of a short presentation (15 minutes) followed by an interactive slide seminar (45 minutes) using whole slide scans for the specimens and sites listed above. The meeting would be suitable for trainee and practising pathologists and BMS. The aims include

discussion of a diagnostic approach to various cytology specimens, the use of international terminology systems and good report writing.

Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete 26 mandatory elearning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical examiner training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a <u>model</u> job description, is on the College website.

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to get the most out of the training day. The e-learning modules <u>can be accessed here</u>. (Registration with e-Learning for Healthcare is required.)
