Demonstration of the LEPT System

The LEPT system is for medical trainees (specialty registrars) in chemical pathology and histopathology. It is a webbased system for workplace-based assessment and multi-source feedback, which also includes an e-portfolio to support the Annual Review of Competence Progression process. College signs memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Egyptian Military Medical Services

Last month, the College strengthened its relationship with Egypt through the signing of a MOU with the Egyptian Military Medical Services (EMMS) in Cairo. The signing took place during the College's first International Pathology Summer School, which was organised in partnership with the Armed Forces College of Medicine (AFCM) and the Egyptian Committee of Pathology Training (ECPT). Under the MOU, the College, EMMS and AFCM will work together to improve standards, training and the practice of pathology and laboratory medicine in Egypt.

National Infection Update 2017

Friday 15 September 2017 CPD Credits: 5 To be held at Coin Street Conference Centre, 108 Stamford Street, London, SE1 9NH

This day has been devised as an infection update for those working or interested in infection specialties including microbiology, virology and infectious diseases. It is suitable for both trainees and consultants to equip them with knowledge and skills for specialist practice, assessment and continuing professional development.

Cytopathology Study Day

Monday 18 September 2017 CPD: 5 Credits To be held in in the General Classroom, Hodgkin Building, KCL, Guy's Hospital, Great Maze Pond, London SE1 9RT

This one-day meeting will discuss a selection of specimen types with challenging morphology and the role of emerging terminologies and ancillary tests. Reporting terminologies for salivary gland and thyroid are among the highlights of the meeting. Microscopy sessions will include these as well as a range of other cytology samples including breast, pancreas, EBUS, urine and serous fluid cytology. This study day is aimed at trainees and consultants in cytopathology, particularly those newly qualified or interested in updating their knowledge.

Gynaecological Pathology reporting: What really matters - When and Why

Monday 16 October 2017 To be held at: The Royal College of Psychiatrists, 21 Prescot Street, London E1 8BB

6 CPD Credits

It is important for histopathologists to understand the clinical significance of their reports and how a data item that is critical in one clinical scenario may be entirely irrelevant in another setting. This novel study day aimed at senior trainees and consultant histopathologists will explain how gynaecological pathology data is used to guide patient management as well as discussing the significance of each data item in different clinical scenarios and specimen types. The course will enable attendees to adopt a more efficient personalised approach to histopathology reporting by focusing on accurately reporting data items that are clinically relevant in a particular case.

Gastrointestinal Pathology: Diagnosis and recent advances Wednesday 22 November 2017

To be held at: Coin Street Conference Centre, 108 Stamford Street, London SE1 9NH

CPD Credits: 5

This is a one-day course, comprising an update and review of gastrointestinal (GI) pathology. It should be suitable for specialist GI pathologists, consultants with a GI pathology interest, and relatively senior trainees. The speakers include two internationally recognised and highly distinguished experts, Dr Robert Odze from the United States and Dr Karel Geboes from Belgium. Also on the programme are several very experienced UK-based GI pathologists. Emphasis is on the histological diagnosis and classification of non-neoplastic and neoplastic disease, and on clinicopathological correlation.

First Bi-Annual UK Endocrine Pathology Society/Royal College of Pathologists Endocrine Pathology Update

Friday 2 and Saturday 3 February 2018

To be held at: Royal College of General Practitioners, 30 Euston Square, London, NW1 2FB

CPD credits: 8

This meeting will be aimed at consultants with a special interest (or aiming to specialise) in endocrine pathology and will also be suitable for trainees approaching FRCPath Part 2. The faculty includes nationally and internationally recognised experts in endocrine pathology and oncology.

<u>Liver Biopsy in the Assessment of Medical Liver Disease</u> Friday 23 February 2018

To be held at: The Royal College of Psychiatrists, 21 Prescot Street, London E1 8BB

CPD Credits: 5

This course will provide a practical diagnostic approach to reporting medical liver biopsies, focusing on the importance of clinico-pathological correlation in assessing common patterns of liver damage. Recommended for senior trainees in pathology and hepatology and consultant histopathologists and gastroenterologists who are regularly involved in liver biopsy assessment (without necessarily working in a Liver Unit).

NEWS FROM EXTERNAL ORGANISATIONS

Serious Hazards of Transfusion (SHOT) – Annual Report – 2016

The College is a key affiliate of SHOT, a UK-wide organisation, established in 1995 to collect and analyse anonymised information on adverse events and reactions in blood transfusion from all healthcare organisations that are involved in the transfusion of blood and blood components.

SHOT publishes an annual report which identifies any risks and problems and makes recommendations to improve patient safety, helping to reduce and manage any serious adverse issues with blood transfusion. The 20th <u>Annual</u> <u>Report</u> covering 2016 was published in July 2017.

Judicial Appointments Commission - Become a tribunal medical member The Social Entitlement Chamber is looking for approximately 200 new medical members to bring their expertise to appeals arising from decisions made about disability benefits. Doctors from all backgrounds can apply.

The Faculty of Medical Leadership and Management (FMLM) – New campaign – the Enlightened Side

FMLM has launched a campaign, the <u>Enlightened Side</u>, to encourage doctors, dentists and students to realise the benefits of developing excellence in medical leadership.

Developing medical leadership is emphasised by the GMC in both the new Generic Professional Capabilitiesⁱ and *Leadership and management for all doctors* (2012).

FMLM's aim is to encourage doctors, dentists and students to recognise the importance of leadership and to find out more about the support on offer to enjoy greater, more fulfilling career opportunities and better outcomes for everyone – patients, teams and for themselves.

National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) Senior Investigators - 11th annual competition launched

Funding will be awarded for three, four or five year appointments upon recommendation of an independent selection panel. Selected Senior Investigators will receive a discretionary research award of £15,000 per annum payable to their employer. Research Capability Funding (RCF) payments of £75,000 per annum are also made to the Senior Investigator's associated NHS organisation to accompany the appointment. The award is designed to fund activities that support Senior Investigators' research.

Leading researchers funded by the NIHR and who are employed by an NHS Trust, university or charity based in England, are encouraged to apply. NIHR Research Professors reaching the end of their term are also invited to apply; providing their term ends by 01 April 2018.
