Pathology Summer School

The College, in partnership with the British Division of the International Academy of Pathology and the Pathological Society, is holding a second annual summer school for UK medical students interested in finding out more about the role of pathology and how pathologists contribute to important advances in healthcare in the UK and beyond.

The school offers students a unique opportunity to hear first hand what it is like to train and work as a pathologist.

It will be held at St. Hilda's College, Oxford on August 21 and 22. Attendance for successful applicants is free, and includes accommodation, meals and two days of activities.

Get Involved: International opportunities Myanmar

The College is working with the Myanmar Society of Pathologists and the medical university in Yangon on an education programme to raise the standard of pathology practice and to help Myanmar pathologists prepare for the FRCPath examinations.

The education programme will comprise fortnightly lectures on various aspects of anatomical pathology over a weekend. When the cause of death is in the brain Friday 8 May 2015

To be held at The King's Fund, 11 Cavendish Square, London, W1G 0AN

This symposium will concentrate on neuropathological practice as it may present to a pathologist working under a legal authority to determine a cause of death. It is aimed at histopathologists who undertake general coronial autopsies, histopathology trainees and neuropathology trainees. Practitioners will also be informed about the post-mortem framework and diagnostic recommendations from The Royal College of Pathologists and will be able to apply these to their practice in making a determination of a cause of death when it is in the brain.
