Background	The histopathological examination of the placenta can play a vital role in the management of future pregnancies as well as management of newborns.					
	The <i>Tissue Pathway for Histological Examination of the Placenta</i> provides guidance on current accepted practice for the diagnostic approach and reporting of such specimens.					
Aim & objectives	To determine the percentage of placenta histopathology reports that meet the recommended criteria for specimen handling and report content (see sections 4, 5 and 6 of <i>Tissue Pathway for Histopathological Examination of the Placenta</i>).					
Standards & criteria	Criteria range: 95% of reports fulfil the minimum requirements.					
	The agreed standards: each report should include the minimum descriptors as defined in the tissue pathway. There will be some cases when it is not possible to insert all data items, e.g. traumatised specimens where tissue is not submitted for examination. All reports where possible should include a comment with indicative clinicopathological correlation.					
Method	Sample selection:					
	Review 10% of finalised reports for one calendar month from current year and the previous year.					
	Record whether the data items outlined below are/are not included in each report.
