Terms of Reference

1. The College's Mission Statement

The Royal College of Pathologists' mission is to: advance the science and practice of pathology; further public education in the field of pathology; and, promote study, research and innovation in pathology and disseminate results.

2. Purpose

The Trainees Advisory Committee has delegated responsibility from Council for matters of concern to trainees.

3. Duties and Responsibilities

Trainee concerns.

4. Accountability and Delegation

- Advising Council and Trustee Board on matters of concern to trainees which are within the remit of the College and seek ways to respond to these concerns
- Informing committee members of Council's activities
- Considering matters suggested for discussion by Council, Specialty Advisory and other College Committees
- Disseminating information about College activities amongst all pathology trainees
- Receiving biannual reports from each representative, either in writing or orally, on the relevant specialty committee and/or sub-committee on which they sit
- Reporting regularly to Council on Committee deliberations and activities
- Providing a written report of Committee's activities to the College Annual Report
- Working in collaboration with the College learning team.

5. Membership

The Royal College of Pathologists understands the value and strength that diversity brings and we are proud to be an organisation of members from a wide range of backgrounds. We are keen to encourage and enable more people of all identities and from all backgrounds to become involved in the College.

The membership shall comprise the following:

- Chair
- Vice-Chair, appointed from existing committee membership
- Representation from examination specialties
- Trainees from each specialty
- Honorary Officer representation (ex officio). Officers are all ex-officio members of committees and should be included in any item that requires a vote
- Lay Member
- Co-opted other specialist society

A request for additional members will be submitted to Council.
