Pledges include a guarantee in law from the Liberal Democrats that patients referred for cancer treatment will be seen in two months, and the new £30m fund from the Conservatives to speed up adoption of new tech in the NHS and an increase in medical school places.

Labour has promised NHS reform, an expansion of the workforce, more tech and an emphasis on AI.

We will review the announcements in light of preparations of the College manifesto, which we will publish before the 2024 general election.

We had a very useful discussion on pathology and healthcare in Wales, the devolved nations and the UK as a whole. We're looking forward to working together to improve pathology services and patient care in Wales and the UK.
- Dr Bernie Croal, attended a House of Commons reception organised by <u>BIVDA</u> where he met Maggie Throup MP who is Chair of our <u>APPG for</u> <u>Diagnostics</u>. Our aim is to work more closely with the diagnostics industry to

better promote the importance of pathology.

 Dr Srinivas Annavarapu, Chair of the SAC on Prenatal, Perinatal and Paediatric Pathology, attended a roundtable on Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood, organised by the Department for Health and Social Care. It was an excellent forum to raise the need to increase recruitment of perinatal pathologists and we will continue to follow up on this.

Working for members

Joint statement with the Institute of Biomedical Science (IBMS) on developing the role of scientists in histopathology reporting

Biomedical scientist reporting of abnormal cervical cytology screening cases has been accepted practice for 20 years.

This has been followed by the biomedical scientist reporting of selected ophthalmic pathology samples and malignant non-gynaecological cytology. A more recent development is the extension of training to include the histopathological reporting of cases from pre-determined body systems (gynaecological and gastrointestinal tracts and skin). Since the introduction of the joint RCPath and IBMS histopathology reporting qualification in 2016, 16 biomedical scientists have successfully completed its rigorous training course and 72 more are in various stages of training and are expected to qualify over the next 4 years. The College published an updated joint statement with the <u>IBMS</u> to reflect these developments, which you can view <u>here</u>.

The Pathology Portal has grown to over 4,500 resources, accessed over 75,000 times. The resources include a variety of cases, videos, podcasts, quizzes for assessing learning and other relevant educational materials, and cater to the professional development needs of pathologists worldwide, with a userbase of over 2,000 users.

Download your ePortfolio training items from the old LEPT system

College members who used the old LEPT system during their training are invited to download all their training items to their own device. This must be done by 15 December 2023.

Following the above date, the old LEPT system will cease to exist and all content will be irretrievably deleted.

Apply to be a CESR Assessor

If you are interested in becoming involved with the College, becoming a Certificate of Eligibility for Specialist Registration (CESR) assessor is a good way to do so. The role of a CESR assessor is to determine whether or not each CESR applicant meets the standard for their speciality and either recommend applicants for entry to the Specialist Register or outline what more needs to be done to meet the standard. Training and ongoing support will be provided and CESR assessors can self-accredit for CPD points for each CESR evaluation they undertake.

Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete mandatory 26 elearning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical examiner training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a <u>model</u> job description, is on the College website.

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to get the most out of the training day. The e-learning modules <u>can be accessed here</u>. (Registration with e-Learning for Healthcare is required.
