Keep all curricula and assessment systems under review, making sure they maintain four-country endorsement and meet professional requirements and regulatory standards.

Optimise the efficiency and effectiveness of the examination process by developing centralised systems and providing enhanced support for examiners

Continue to develop an electronic infrastructure for examinations and optimise the efficiency of the marking process.

Provide support to pathologists working outside the UK to prepare for the College's exams

Pilot the College's recognition framework and process for non-UK postgraduate specialty training and residency programmes.

Provide our members with opportunities to increase their professional knowledge of the latest developments, innovations and technologies

Develop and deliver high-quality education for pathologists at all stages of their career through blended learning; for example, continuing professional development (CPD) approved conferences, symposia, webinars and e-learning.

Encourage our members and trainees to undertake and publish high-quality research to advance the practice of pathology

- Use the RCPath online publishing gateway to develop an open access research community to promote and publish the results of research in pathology.
- Support the involvement of trainees in research by offering bursaries to medical and scientific trainees publishing on the RCPath online publishing gateway.
- Award annual research prizes to trainees.
- Improve the information and support available to members and trainees pursuing research in pathology, including CPD and learning courses.
- Work with other professional organisations to promote research and careers in research.

Deliver high standards, audit and quality assurance practices

- Produce independently accredited clinical guidelines to support best practice.
- Increase our support to volunteer guideline authors.
- Support enhancement of pathology services by promoting continuous quality improvement and assurance methodologies.
- Provide expertise to support employers and provider organisations through our invited review service and RCPath Consulting.
- Provide College input into the consultant appointment process to ensure recruitment of the highest quality pathologists.
- Maintain a user friendly CPD portfolio.
- Work with many others (including external quality assessment providers, UKAS and the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency) to improve the governance of external quality surveillance.

Lead on emerging innovations

- Promote the development and implementation of diagnostic digital pathology.
- Support implementation and education for new services such as genomic medicine, gene editing, molecular testing, liquid biopsy and augmented intelligence.

Develop an actively engaged membership

- Encourage members to engage with the work of the College by communicating with them and regularly inviting their views.
- Value members who are actively engaged in College activity by ensuring adequate recognition by employers that allows them time to engage in this important work on behalf of the wider NHS and healthcare systems.
- Support the development of medical examiners by offering training, support and College affiliation.
- Seek and respond to the views and needs of members.

- Promote pathology and the College to targeted audiences to increase the strategic influence and reach of the College on issues including workforce and patient safety.
- Continue to improve communications to medical and non-medical audiences about the central role of pathologists in healthcare, and the work that we do. Recognise the expertise and contribution of the wider pathology workforce by expanding opportunities for College membership.

Support current and future pathologists throughout their careers

- Inspire the next generation of pathologists by creating opportunities to promote pathology at undergraduate, foundation and postgraduate levels to improve recruitment.
- Provide support and opportunities for members to promote pathology.
- Work with specialty advisory committees and others to provide expert guidance and advice in their specialties, including delivering opportunities for CPD to professionals in their fields.

Influence policy to advance patient care and safety

- Work with influential contacts to showcase the work of the profession to raise awareness and understanding of pathology and its contribution to the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of disease.
- Work with governments, associated bodies, opinion formers and decision makers to raise awareness of the role pathology plays in providing safer patient care.
- Work in partnership with members, specialist societies and charities to make sure our impact on patient care is as effective as possible and that we reach our key audiences.
