# President's Message

# **RCPath Workforce Survey 2023**

Advocating for pathology and securing the level of investment and support it needs is one of our key priorities. We invest a significant level of resource into influencing politicians, the NHS and other stakeholders to achieve this but we can only do this successfully if we have the right evidence and data.

This survey will give us the core data we need to build a clear picture of workforce capacity and demand which, in turn, will inform the insights and intelligence that underpins our advocacy work.

The survey, which is being sent to Clinical Directors, will cover workload, staffing, vacancies, locum cover and the working environment.

#### Spring Budget 2023

The College has taken every opportunity to make the case for NHS pension reform with parliamentarians and policymakers and we welcome the changes the government has announced.

Members have told us that the widely reported problems with the pension scheme led to some reducing their hours or taking early retirement.

The changes announced in the <u>Spring Budget</u> will, in part, help retain our skilled and experienced pathologists in the NHS.

Alongside our colleagues at the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges and other medical royal colleges, restructuring the NHS pension scheme has been a core element of our advocacy work.

### Junior doctors' industrial action

The College has a published a <u>statement</u> on the industrial action by junior doctors in England. The decision to undertake industrial action is not one junior doctors have taken lightly. They care deeply about patient care and safety. While the College is not a trade union and cannot get involved in negotiating terms and conditions of employment, we do have a duty to maintain standards for the benefit of patients.

We welcome the news that parties have agreed to talks with the aim of coming to a mutually agreeable solution for the benefit of patients.

# RCPath Achievement Awards 2023 – Nominations Open

The RCPath Achievement Awards are an opportunity to celebrate the hard work, innovation and enterprise of pathology teams. We will be awarding four RCPath Achievement Awards to teams who have achieved above and beyond what would be expected in their usual course of their work.

### Professor Freddie Flynn Bursary Prize

The College administers the Professor Freddie Flynn Bursary Prizes, which award up to five bursary prizes of up to £750 for trainees to attend the <u>Association for Clinical Biochemistry and Laboratory</u> <u>Medicine's</u> annual focus meeting (<u>MedLab23</u>).

Applicants are accepted from medical or clinical scientist trainees on recognised UK training programmes in either laboratory or clinical aspects of clinical biochemistry/chemical pathology. ### Pathology Portal

The Pathology Portal has updates to support new formats in whole slide imaging, allowing a range of high-quality slides, including z-stacked images to be viewed and studied. Annotations and assessments on whole slide images have been added and work is taking place to upload around 100 haematology teaching slides. In other content, there has been a donation of <u>endoscopy videos</u> and several new editors have joined the clinical biochemistry team to help supply the content our trainees and biochemists have been requesting.

# Fellowship Research Start-Up Grant – deadline 11 April

The College Research Committee is pleased to announce the launch of the Fellowship Research Start-Up Grant, which provides support to postgraduate and undergraduate students at the beginning of their research project for up to one year. A maximum amount of £4,000 is awarded to postgraduate students and £1,000 to undergraduate students. The grants can support work in any discipline of medical or veterinary pathology and are not restricted to cellular pathology or histopathology.

#### Apply to be a CESR Assessor

If you are interested in becoming involved with the College, becoming a Certificate of Eligibility for Specialist Registration (CESR) assessor is a good way to do so. The role of a CESR assessor is to determine whether or not each CESR applicant meets the standard for their speciality and either recommend applicants for entry to the Specialist Register, or outline what more needs to be done to meet the standard. Training and ongoing support will be provided and CESR assessors can self-accredit for CPD points for each CESR evaluation they undertake.

We are excited to bring to you this in person paediatric dermatopathology course. This course is aimed at paediatric histopathologists, dermatopathologists and trainees who want to gain more insight into paediatric dermatopathology. It is a one-day course designed to learn from the experts about challenging cases in this field.

### New Consultants' Day – Hybrid event

#### 3 May 2023 6 CPD Credits

The New Consultants' Day is an event to help and support recently appointed consultants, or those who will soon be taking one up. It is appropriate for all pathology specialties and for both medically trained pathologists and clinical scientists.

You will hear from experienced consultants on a range of topics such as how to prepare a business case to secure resources, set up new services and how best to deal with complaints. Delegates will also learn more about appraisal, revalidation and job planning (parallel session for medically trained pathologists) and the experiences of consultant clinical scientists (parallel session for clinical scientists). This event is most suitable for those appointed to a consultant post within the last year, or who expect to be appointed to a consultant post within the next year.

#### Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete 26 mandatory elearning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical examiner training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

#### Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or

bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a <u>model job</u> <u>description, is on the College website.</u>

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to get the most out of the training day. The e-learning modules <u>can be accessed here</u>. (Registration with e-Learning for Healthcare is required.)
