Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists (FRCPath) examination

Trainees must pass the FRCPath Part 2 examination by the end of ST4(6). Trainees who have not passed the FRCPath Part 2 examination by the end of ST4(6) will be prevented from progressing to Stage D of training. Trainees will be allowed to progress to Stage D if their written project (an existing element required to achieve FRCPath) has been submitted to the College and will be complete within the first six months of Stage D. Where the project was considered of such poor quality to require significant additional work or re-write, it will need to be re-submitted and approved before Stage C can be considered complete.

Closing dates for applications to enter the FRCPath examination in 2015 are:

- Friday 9 January 2015
- Friday 10 July 2015

Please note these dates are provisional and subject to changes

Annual Review of Competence Progression (ARCP)

The ARCP is a deanery-led process that should take place towards the end of the trainee's year of training. The outcome of the ARCP determines the trainee's progress through training. Trainees should ensure that they record all of their training and assessment activities using the LEPT system in preparation for their ARCP.

To enable progression at ARCP trainees must provide evidence of:





- 6 satisfactory outcomes for each workplace-based assessment tool
- A pass in the FRCPath Part 2 examination.

All trainees should ensure that they have a mid year or mid placement review (MYR/MPR). The MYR/MPR should ensure that the trainee is on course to complete the curriculum and assessment requirements of the year.
