On the agenda

- I had a fantastic day at the <u>Eisteddfod</u> promoting pathology in Wales and across the country. The virtual autopsy by Emyr Benbow was outstanding and well received. Thank you, Wales.
- Dr Srinivas Annavarapu, Chair of the Perinatal and Paediatric and Specialty Advisory Committee, and I met NHS England to discuss the best approach to tackling the workforce crisis in perinatal and paediatric pathology. NHSE is keen to deal with this issue and has been in touch with the College for advice.

NHSE has agreed to the following:

- To plan and produce guidance aiming to maximise the resources we have, to benefit the most people.
- There will be NHSE funding to support two teams of people, including some from the RCPath Specialty Advisory Committee, to oversee curriculum design and resource development and demand management.
- To recruit more staff, including from overseas, and work on retention of staff.

This work is now going ahead at pace, and we will also stay engaged with the <u>APPG on baby loss</u>, and the <u>Maternity APPG</u>, with updates on how things progress.

Government's Our Plan for Patients statement

The Government's plan outlines introducing quicker, easier access to diagnostic services through 160 Community Diagnostic Centres. However this will need significant new resources including pathology services and staffing. Read more on the College website.

I have also written to the new Health Secretary Therese Coffey to highlight the vital role pathology plays in healthcare and to ensure that the work of members is at the forefront of discussions in parliament. We have asked for a meeting with the Health Secretary and will pursue this.

College conferences and symposia

RCPath Virology Study Day – Virtual Meeting

Wednesday 28 September 2022

CPD Credits: 4

This day has been devised for those working or interested in infection specialties including virology, microbiology, and infectious diseases. The programme should be of interest to all levels and aims to give trainees the opportunity for consultant led, interactive teaching to equip them with knowledge and skills for specialist medical microbiology and virology practice.

<u>RCPATH workshop: CNS tumour WHO 2021 and methylation profiling – update</u> <u>recommendations</u>

Friday 30 September 2022 CPD Credits: 6

This one-day workshop will provide a detailed update on the changes in the CNS tumour WHO 2021 classification covering diagnostic aspects of adult and paediatric brain tumours. The workshop will also address the advances in methylation profiling of intrinsic tumours as well as meningiomas. The workshop will be complemented by an interactive practical session where participants will have the opportunity to discuss the diagnostic approaches using CNS WHO 2021 classification and methylation profiling. The cases included in the interactive session will be available to view in a digital format prior, during and after the workshop for registered participants.

The target audience for this workshop are neuropathologists, pathologists, neurooncologists, neurosurgeons, neuroscientists and other healthcare professionals involved in adult and paediatric brain tumour diagnostics, treatment, or research.

Advances in Transfusion Medicine - Virtual Event (rcpath.org)

23 and 24 November 2020 CPD credits: 4 per day

There are exciting ongoing developments in transfusion medicine and science with high quality research supporting evidence-based practice. This virtual meeting will be held over two half days and has been organised on behalf of the College in collaboration with the Serious Hazards of Transfusion (SHOT) UK Haemovigilance Scheme. The meeting brings together experts from various clinical disciplines with leaders in transfusion science to provide an update on key developments. The meeting will be of interest to all those involved in transfusion medicine.

Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete mandatory 26 e-learning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical examiner training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a model job description, is on the College website.

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to get the most out of the training day. Two new haematological malignancy diagnostic classifications

The publication of two new haematological malignancy diagnostic classifications: the World Health Organisation (WHO) 5th edition and the International Consensus Classification (ICC) is expected soon. The outlines have recently been published in *Leukemia* and *Blood*,

respectively. While for most part they agree and overlap with each other, the two classifications do differ in some areas. The British Society for Haematology (BSH) and British Lymphoma Pathology Group (BLPG) have been asked to help with this issue and want to provide some interim guidance for members, while planning formal definitive guidance.
