Places are still available at this year's <u>RideLondon-Surrey 100</u> event, which is taking place on Sunday 30 July 2017. The much-needed funds raised will be used to support Mubende Regional Referral Hospital in Uganda to establish a regional blood donation and transfusion service. The hospital serves a population of more than 2 million but there is no blood donation and transfusion service for the region. This means that every summer, the hospital experiences a marked increase in the maternal mortality rate due to a lack of available blood for transfusion during childbirth.
