Engaging parliamentarians and stakeholders

Autumn marks the start of the political party conference season. Professor Sarah Coupland, Vice President for Communications and I will be attending roundtable events at the Conservative and Labour party conferences. Organised by the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges, the events will highlight the needs of members with parliamentarians. The new Prime Minister and possibly a new Health Secretary will be in place so it will be a good opportunity to advocate for pathology services and raise pressing workforce issues.

We responded to the Health and Social Care Committee's reports 'Workforce: recruitment, training and retention in health and social care' and the Expert Panel: evaluation of Government's commitments in the area of the health and social care workforce in England. We have repeatedly called for real action from Government to address potentially catastrophic workforce issues to ensure patients receive the best care – impossible without the right diagnosis.

College Influence

I'm pleased to be speaking at a Westminster Health Forum conference on 7 November discussing next steps for cancer prevention, diagnosis, treatment and care in England. I will be joining an excellent line up of speakers from organisations such as Macmillan Cancer Support, the Royal College of Radiologists and the UK National Screening Committee.

We helped promote a one-day conference, Pathologists for Ukraine that was organised by the German Division of International Academy of Pathology. All participation fees go to Ukrainian medical care and on-site diagnostics.

RCPath/Specialist Society Medical Elective small grant scheme

The College is delighted to announce a new RCPath/Specialist Society Medical Elective small grant scheme, launched to mark the College's Diamond Jubilee.

The scheme is jointly funded by the College and partner societies and will offer grants of up to £1,000. The grants will help to support undergraduate medical and veterinary students who wish to undertake electives in pathology disciplines.

Electives may be clinical or research-based and may be undertaken in any part of the world.

A minimum of £500 must be used for student travel and subsistence with the remaining amount being spent flexibly for project-related costs such as consumables, or for student costs, as appropriate for the project. Applications for this year are now open. The closing date is Friday 9

September 2022. Successful candidates will be informed in October 2022.

<u>RCPATH workshop: CNS tumour WHO 2021 and methylation profiling – update</u> recommendations

Friday 30 September 2022

CPD Credits: 6

This one-day workshop will provide a detailed update on the changes in the CNS tumour WHO 2021 classification covering diagnostic aspects of adult and paediatric brain tumours. The workshop will also address the advances in methylation profiling of intrinsic tumours as well as meningiomas. The workshop will be complemented by an interactive practical session where participants will have the opportunity to discuss the diagnostic approaches using CNS WHO 2021 classification and methylation profiling. The cases included in the interactive session will be available to view in a digital format prior, during and after the workshop for registered participants.

The target audience for this workshop are neuropathologists, pathologists, neuroscientists and other healthcare professionals involved in adult and paediatric brain tumour diagnostics, treatment, or research

Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete mandatory 26 e-learning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical examiner training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians

and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a <u>model job description</u>, is on the <u>College website</u>.

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to get the most out of the training day. The e-learning modules <u>can be accessed here</u>. (Registration with e-Learning for Healthcare is required.)
