President's Message

NHS 10-year plan (England)

The consultation for the <u>10 year plan for the NHS</u> in England is currently underway, and the College, with input from officers, senior staff, and College committees have been formulating our submission which is due in at the start of December.

The three healthcare shifts advocated by government will likely form the basis of the eventual plan to be launched in the Spring of 2025. Clearly pathology will be vital for the shift to prevention, the shift to digital and the shift to community - all of which will need robust and well-resourced pathology services. We will be sharing our final response with you once it has been submitted.

Parliamentary and stakeholder engagement

- We welcomed the increased funding for the NHS outlined in the first budget of the new government. However there needs to be stronger investment in diagnostics, especially in pathology. <u>Our response</u> highlighted that pathology is vital for diagnosis, treatment and prevention and needs sustained investment.
- The <u>Wales Coastal Walk</u>, led and organised by Wales Regional Council Chair Dr Anu Gunavardhan, highlighted the work of pathologists in the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and monitoring of rare diseases. Cllr Gwenda Roberts, Mayor of Penarth, Jenny Rathbone MS, SWAN clinic, Ethnic Minority Women in Welsh Health Care and <u>Nerve</u> <u>Tumours UK</u> joined Welsh Council members on the walk.

International Pathology Day 2024

I was delighted to host International Pathology Day earlier this month. I was joined by over 100 delegates from around the world to hear about the global challenges of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR). Dame Sally Davies, the UK's Special Envoy on Antimicrobial Resistance, was the special guest and gave some insightful views about her experiences and work. As well as Dame Sally, we were joined by experts from Canada, Hong Kong, Nigeria and the UK offering their insights on AMR; exploring challenges and opportunities and comparing and highlighting similar experiences.

The Pathology Portal – EQA circulations

The Pathology Portal features over 5,800 resources across various specialties, including case studies, lectures, recap videos, podcasts, and quizzes. Designed to support the professional development of pathologists at all career stages, these resources have been accessed more than 215,000 times by over 4,500 users.

Over the past month we have seen an increase in the number of EQA circulations being hosted on the Pathology Portal, providing easy access to highly detailed whole slide images as well as post EQA reports, giving the opportunity for future use to those not involved in the 'live' circulation.

A number of people have contacted us to provide content and discuss potential educational contributions to the Portal in areas such as haematology, medical microbiology and virology.

The Pathology Portal team would like to remind users that a downloadable learning record is available from the Learning Hub, which can be used to support self-accreditation of CPD.

College Courses

An update on feline soft tissue sarcomas; where are we now, and where do we go next?

12.30pm, Tuesday 3 December 2024

The past, the present and hopefully the future of prognosticating feline soft tissue sarcomas; this webinar aims to give an overview of where we currently are regarding the histological grading of feline soft tissue sarcomas, with some insight into the origins via grading STS in humans and canine, and the development of the proposed grading system in cats. It will look at some of the challenges, including nomenclature, subtyping, the complication of feline injection site sarcomas, and the subjectivity of some aspects. It will also look at where we would like to go in the future....

This webinar will focus on the findings related to resuscitation in pre-hospital settings. We will explore common iatrogenic injuries that can arise during resuscitation attempts. We will discuss the various medical devices and procedures used in the field, alongside the significance of post-mortem findings. The role of pathology in farm animal disease surveillance - webinar

Cytology of the Respiratory System and Thorax - webinar

The talk will involve canine and feline case presentations of various pathologic processes of the respiratory system and thorax, with real-time viewing of digital slides via screen-sharing. Samples studied may include respiratory washes, thoracic effusions and FNAs of solid masses of the nasal passages, lungs and mediastinum. The talk is aimed at residents training in clinical pathology, medicine and oncology. Residents training in anatomic pathology and veterinary practitioners with an interest in cytology may also find it relevant.

Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete mandatory 26 elearning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical Examiner Training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a <u>model job</u> <u>description, is on the College website.</u>

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to get the most out of the training day. The e-learning modules <u>can be accessed here</u>. (Registration with e-Learning for Healthcare is required.)
