Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists (FRCPath) examination

In Stage B/ST2(4), trainees should be starting to actively consider when they will apply for the FRCPath Part 1 examination. IT is expected that trainees will normally have passed the FRCPath Part 1 examination by the end of ST3(5). Trainees who have not passed the FRCPath Part 1 examination by the end of ST3(5) will be prevented from progressing to Stage C of training. This may result in an extension to training through the ARCP process.

The written project/dissertation (module 3) is an integral part of the Chemical Pathology FRCPath Part 2 examination. It should be noted that proposals for the FRCPath Part 2 written project can be submitted to the Examinations Department at any time, including prior to attempting the FRCPath Part 1 examination. Work on the project can begin as soon as the project proposal has been approved.

Trainees must have completed their project within the first six months of Stage D training in order to be able to proceed to CCT.

Closing dates for applications to enter the FRCPath examination in 2015 are:

- **Friday 9 January 2015**
- **Friday 10 July 2015**

Please note these dates are provisional and subject to changes



Annual Review of Competence Progression (ARCP)

The ARCP is a deanery-led process that should take place towards the end of the trainee's year of training. The outcome of the ARCP determines the trainee's progress through training. Trainees should ensure that they record all of their training and assessment activities using the LEPT system in preparation for their ARCP.

To enable progression at ARCP trainees must provide evidence of 6 satisfactory outcomes for each workplace-based assessment tool.

Trainees may also provide evidence of a pass in the FRCPATH Part 1 examination.

All trainees should ensure that they have a mid year or mid placement review (MYR/MPR). The MYR/MPR should ensure that the trainee is on course to complete the curriculum and assessment requirements of the year.
