### President's Messages of the Month

Welcome to my March e-newsletter, slightly later than usual as I've been travelling on College business. The most important news is that we have just received planning permission to redevelop the Goodman Building, the College's new premises on Alie Street. Work will begin soon on demolishing the current building. Please keep an eye out for regular updates on progress on the College website.

The last few weeks have been busy, with important government announcements, consultations and publications. Unfortunately the dispute over the junior doctors' contract continues - the College is doing what it can to support its trainees and I remain grateful to senior members for minimising the impact on patient care during industrial action. I'll be going into all these issues in more detail in my column for the April issue of the Bulletin. Highlights for now include:

# Government introduces medical examiners

The Secretary of State's <u>announcement</u> to introduce medical examiners is a welcome step forward in improving patient safety in the NHS.

The College has <u>long campaigned for</u> <u>their implementation</u> and will be submitting a full response to the government's <u>consultation</u>.

# Devolved regional council manifestos and policy launches

For the first time, the College has produced pathology policy manifestos for the devolved nation elections which will take place in May this year. Wales Regional Council Chair Dr Esther Youd launched <u>Pathology Priorities for Wales</u> in Cardiff on St David's Day. On 8 March, the Northern Ireland Regional Council Chair Dr Peter Sharpe launched their <u>pathology services</u> <u>manifesto</u> in Stormont, Belfast. The Scotland Regional Council manifesto will be launched later this month.

Operational productivity and performance in English NHS acute hospitals: Unwarranted variations The College has published its response to Lord Carter's review of operational productivity and performance in English NHS acute hospitals.

### **Clinical Excellence Awards**

The Advisory Committee on Clinical Excellence Awards (ACCEA) have announced the dates for this year's Clinical Excellence Awards. The round opens on 11 March and closes 16 May. College Fellows applying for College support must submit their applications to mary.kehoe@rcpath.org by noon 19 April. This does not leave long for the College process.
