# President's Message

# Junior doctors' industrial action – update

The College has endorsed the <u>statement</u> from the Academy of Medical Royal <u>Colleges</u> urging all parties to engage with an independent organisation to facilitate a swift resolution for the sake of patients.

The College has a published a <u>statement</u> on the industrial action by junior doctors in England.

While the College is not a trade union and cannot get involved in negotiating terms and conditions of employment, we do have a duty to maintain standards for the benefit of patients.

# Membership Engagement Tour

The first stage of my membership engagement tour is complete and we are now looking at your feedback. We have heard from trainees, members and Fellows from our specialties, and common themes are emerging. Recruitment and retention challenges were a major concern, as were workload and how resources are allocated. <u>The April *Bulletin*</u> includes more information and data about the tour.

We will be using this data to shape our work to your needs and to inform our advocacy priorities. Look out for further updates in the newsletter and our website.

## **RCPath Workforce Survey 2023**

The College's workforce survey will give us the core data we need to build a clear picture of workforce capacity and demand which, in turn, will inform the insights and intelligence that underpins our advocacy work.

The survey has been sent to Clinical Directors and covers workload, staffing, vacancies, locum cover and the working environment.

We know that many of you, including those working in cellular pathology and clinical biochemistry/chemical pathology, will have submitted similar data to NHS bodies recently. If this is the case for your department and you have recently sent NHS England and Improvement your data, you can submit this to us. We will work with you to collate your data and get back to you to ask for any additional information we may need. You can find further information on our <u>website</u>.

We are also aware of the current workforce pressures and know these have been intensified by the recent junior doctors' strikes. We are therefore extending the deadline for **completion of the survey to Friday 26 May.**

## Bowel Cancer All Party Parliamentary Group

It was fantastic to meet Ben Lake MP, Chair of the Bowel Cancer All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG), together with MPs Rebecca Long-Bailey and Gerald Jones, who are on the committee.

The APPG held a meeting to mark <u>Bowel</u> <u>Cancer Awareness Month</u>. We had good discussion on the need to support pathology, radiology and diagnostics.

They were also particularly interested in cancer services and the integral role of pathology.

## Other engagement with parliamentarians and stakeholders

- Humza Yousaf MSP has been appointed as First Minister of Scotland. We have written to him to congratulate him and highlight the issues facing pathologists. The new Health Minister is Michael Matheson who we have also written to, requesting a meeting.
- Along with 80 other organisations, we signed a <u>statement co-</u> <u>ordinated by National Voices</u>, a coalition of health and social care charities, regarding the prolonged and intense workforce pressures facing health and social care. The statement urges government to take immediate and urgent action including the publication of the long-awaited NHS Workforce Plan.
- We were pleased to join the Royal College of Emergency Medicine at their Emergency Care Summit in the House of Lords to discuss how to tackle the emergency care crisis. Panellists listed a number of priorities: workforce, retention, investment in planning and capacity, social care, ensuring NHS 111 can refer patients to the right service, and patients with mental health needs.

## GMC national training survey

The General Medical Council's (GMC) 2023 national training survey is open until 4 May.

The survey gives trainees and trainers the opportunity to share their views of postgraduate training in the UK.

As a medical royal college, we will also review the data to check that trainees are receiving high-quality training and that trainers are supported in their roles. This year's survey also includes new questions that will help the GMC to better understand the impact discrimination and unprofessional behaviours have on training environments. # Professor Freddie Flynn Bursary Prize

The College administers the Professor Freddie Flynn Bursary Prizes, which award up to five bursary prizes of up to £750 for trainees to attend the <u>Association for Clinical Biochemistry and Laboratory</u> <u>Medicine's</u> annual focus meeting (<u>MedLab23</u>).

Applicants are accepted from medical or clinical scientist trainees on recognised UK training programmes in either laboratory or clinical aspects of clinical biochemistry/chemical pathology. ## The Pathology Portal

The Pathology Portal continues to develop including updates to allow faster processing of whole slide images, allowing a range of high-quality slides, including z-stacked images to be viewed and studied.

Work is taking place to upload haematology teaching slides and the haematology team is working collectively on addressing gaps in content.

There has been an excellent donation of endoscopy videos from an expert in Ukraine, and some pathology of these from his histopathology colleague, to support training in bowel screening.

Several new editors have been welcomed to the team to support the next phase of clinical biochemistry as well as paediatric and perinatal pathology content.

#### Medical examiner training

The College is the <u>lead medical royal college for medical examiners</u> and provides training for any doctor wishing to work as a medical examiner. Participants will need to complete 26 mandatory elearning modules and attend an entire face-to-face training day to receive a certificate of completion. The day includes short presentations, small group discussions of case scenarios and the opportunity to share experience. Medical examiner training is open only to medically qualified individuals who work in England and Wales.

New medical examiners who successfully complete the training and the e-learning modules will be invited to join the College as members.

Medical examiner officer training

The College also leads on the training of medical examiner officers (MEOs).

MEOs work closely with medical examiners and undertake tasks such as coordinating the completion of death certificates and referrals to the coroner, and speaking to clinicians and bereaved families.

MEOs may come from a wide range of backgrounds. For example, nurses, healthcare scientists or bereavement officers although this list is not exhaustive. More information, including a <u>model</u> job description, is on the College website.

The face-to-face training day is the second part of MEO training. Everyone attending the course must have completed the 26 mandatory core e-learning modules before the date of the course to

get the most out of the training day. The e-learning modules <u>can be accessed here</u>. (Registration with e-Learning for Healthcare is required.)
