

## Autumn 2021 Online Examinations

In Autumn 2021, the following examinations will be offered using online delivery to candidates:

- All available Part 1 specialties (please see Appendix 3 in the [Regulations and Guidelines](#) for whether your specialty is offered in the Spring)
- Combined Infection Certificate Examination

All Part 2 examinations, the CHAT, the CHCCT, and Diploma examinations, including those which have been held online in Autumn 2020 and Spring 2021, will be **returning to offline delivery**.

The College will deliver the Part 1 examinations through a company called TestReach.

Candidates will be given the opportunity to trial the TestReach system to familiarise themselves with it ahead of the examination. It is a fully live-proctored system and candidates will be required to complete both an IT system check and environment check before sitting the examination. The system check establishes that the candidate's device is suitable for use for the examination. The environment check establishes that candidates are sitting in a suitable area where they do not have access to textbooks, notes and other revision material.

The TestReach system is able to function with fluctuating internet connectivity, and the system is secure with safeguards in place to prevent cheating (please see the [Online Exams FAQ](#) for more information). We have found that some NHS firewalls can block the TestReach live proctoring software and cause issues that don't show up during the system check, so we recommend that candidates working within the NHS make arrangements to sit the exam from home (or similar).
