This symposium aims to provide guidance to pathologists dealing with nonforensic and Coroner's post-mortem examinations. It presents a platform for pathologists to familiarise themselves with recent published guidelines as well as providing a rare opportunity to discuss challenging cases with experts and guideline authors.

NHS England National Acute Oncology Group Neutropenic sepsis – haematologists' survey

One of the areas the group is focusing on is treatment, looking at current practice and trying to determine what the scope is for earlier use of oral antibiotics and risk-scoring systems. The group sees this as a very important area to examine as it might have significant implications for patients, helping to avoid long stays in hospital as well as from an economic health point of view. The group is looking to obtain information from as wide a representation of haematologists as possible.

Caroline Ford, clinical research fellow with Cancer Research UK and NICE, has produced an online survey about neutropenic sepsis treatment which takes about five minutes to complete. The acute oncology group, which includes haematology and oncology representatives, would be very grateful if you could spare the time to complete the survey.
